This qualification provides a trade outcome in wall and floor tiling for residential and commercial construction work. The qualification has core unit of competency requirements that cover common skills for the construction industry, as well as the specialist field of work, wall and floor tiling.

Tilers work with materials like ceramic, glass, slate, marble and clay. They cut these materials and lay tiles on walls and floors, both interior and exterior.

They may also add decorative touches to their basic work.

Occupational titles may include:

- Tiler
- Wall and Floor tiler

State and territory jurisdictions may have different licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements.

Relevant state and territory regulatory authorities should be consulted to confirm those requirements.

Completion of the general construction induction training program, specified in the Safe Work Australia model Code of Practice: Construction Work, is required by anyone carrying out construction work.

Achievement of CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry meets this requirement.

UNITS OF COMPETENCY

To achieve CPC31320 Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling

3 elective units

To be issued the qualification CPC31320 Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling, a student must be assessed as competent in 20 units of competency and complete the work placements of 360 hours.

COURSE STRUCTURE

CPC31320 Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling is a nationally recognised qualification.

COURSE DELIVERY AND ASSESSMENT

- The required 20 units of competency have been selected.
- The delivery is planned across eight terms.
- The units are delivered in a planned sequence.
- The work placement is planned on a weekly basis
- The course is full time and there are 20 scheduled hours per week delivery.

New Era institute is delivering the 20 units over 8 Terms timetabled as 10-week terms or 80 weeks of study and work placement amounting to 360 hours of scheduled training delivery and assessment. This is a high amount of training hours but considering there are 20 units, it is sufficient to cover the competencies for Wall and Floor Tiling.

COURSE DURATION

- This course is registered for 104 weeks.
- The course will be offered over eight (8) 10-week terms adding up to 80 weeks of full-time study
- Each 10-week term is followed by a term break that varies depending on the annual calendar, totaling 24 weeks.
- The standard timetabling will vary slightly when student undertake work placement as their hours must suit the employer that are offered to the student.

ASSESSMENT METHODS

The assessment is conducted using a combination of realistic workplace tasks, projects, knowledge tests, skill test observations and work placement logbooks.

WORK PLACEMENT

Work placement is conducted in a real workplace site.

Students will be required to attend 360 hours of work placement at a real site in order to complete the course. New Era Institute takes the responsibility of finding the host employer for students to complete the work placement hours.

Students attending work placement are not required to attend classroom.

This course requires manual labour including manual handling and heavy lifting.

Students who participate in this course must be physically fit.

Students with a history of back issues may not be appropriate for this qualification.

RESOURCE REQUIREMENTS

1. Students will be provided with all the tools and equipment required for the work they will be undertaking.
2. Students will be required to access computer/laptop to complete assessments.

At orientation, students will be guided and get more detail about this trade equipment and resources.

AFTER COMPLETION

Students who completed this course gain:

- A nationally recognised industry qualification
- Skills and knowledge to work as Wall and Floor Tiler

EXIT POINT AND PATHWAYS

Students must complete all assessments for each unit of competency to be deemed competent in a unit. All 20 units including the work placement must be completed to gain the full qualification.

After achieving CPC31320 Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling, students can progress to Certificate IV in Building and construction or any other courses.

Students who do not complete the full qualification will receive a Statement of Attainment for all units successfully completed.
